




Indonesia GDP Growth 2015 -2024F



Developing Prabowo's Power Base




Corruption Index Indonesia, 2014 - 2023 (points)







Prabowo's New Ministries: Challenges &



Larger Government \rightarrow Propensity to be inefficient due to overlapping responsibilities

Fortify human resource development, science, technology, education, health, sports, gender equality, women-youth (Millennials & Gen Z) empowerment and people with disabilities



Maintain downstream processing and develop natural resource industries to increase domestic value adds



Build from villages and grassroots to foster economic growth, equitable distribution, and poverty eradication



Improve political, legal, and bureaucratic reforms, and enhance the fight against corruption, drugs, gambling, and smuggling



Promote harmony with the environment, nature, and culture, while fostering religious tolerance to achieve just and prosperous society

Prabowo's 8 Best Projects





Provide free lunches and milk in schools and religious boarding schools, along with nutritional support for toddlers and pregnant women



Organize free health check-ups, eradicate tuberculosis cases, and build fully equipped, high-quality hospitals in every district



Develop and boost agricultural productivity through village, regional, and national food storage systems



Build integrated superior schools in every district and renovate schools in need of repair



Continue and expand social welfare cards and business support cards to eradicate extreme poverty



Increase the salaries of civil servants (especially teachers, lecturers, healthcare workers, and advisors), military/police personnel, and state officials



Maintain rural and urban infrastructure development, direct cash assistance (BLT), and ensure the provision of affordable, well-sanitized housing for those in need



Establish the National Revenue Agency and increase the national revenue-to-GDP ratio to 23%




Ensure healthcare by improving BPJS Health and providing affordable medicines

Guarantee the availability of fertilizers, seeds, and pesticides directly to farmers




Develop high-quality, affordable housing with proper sanitation for rural and urban communities, particularly for the needy

Enforce religious harmony, freedom of worship, and the establishment as well as maintenance of places of worship
